



## Squirmy Worm Facts

- ❁ A worm has no arms, legs or eyes
- ❁ There are about 2,700 different kinds of worm
- ❁ Worms live where there is food, moisture, oxygen, and a favorable temperature. If not, they go somewhere else.
- ❁ In one acre of land, there can be more than a million worms.
- ❁ The largest earthworm ever found was in South Africa and measured 22 feet from its nose to the tip of its tail.
- ❁ Worms tunnel deeply and bring subsoil closer to the surface mixing it with the topsoil. Slime, a secretion of earthworms, contains nitrogen. Nitrogen is an important nutrient for plants.
- ❁ Charles Darwin spent 39 years studying earthworms more than 100 years ago.
- ❁ Worms are cold-blooded animals.
- ❁ Worms can grow a new tail (Pygidium), but not a new head (Postorium).
- ❁ Baby worms hatch from cocoons smaller than a grain of rice.
- ❁ The Australian Gippsland Earthworm grows to 12 feet long and can weigh 1-1/2 pounds.
- ❁ Although eyeless, worms can sense light, especially at their front end.
- ❁ If a worm's skin dries out, it will die.
- ❁ Worms can eat their weight each day.

Australia is the continent of the month.


The Commonwealth of Australia is a country in the southern hemisphere comprising the mainland of the world's smallest continent, the major island of Tasmania and a number of other islands in the Southern, Indian and Pacific Oceans.

The Australian mainland has been inhabited for more than 42,000 years by Indigenous Australians.

After sporadic visits by fishermen from the north and by European explorers and merchants starting in the 17th century, the eastern half of Australia was claimed by the British in 1770 and

initially settled through penal transportation.

Today's population is 25 million, and is concentrated in the mainland state capitals of Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane,


**Coats!** — Please be sure your child's coat is weather appropriate.


